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PREFACE

Vocational Nursing Program Student Guide

The Vocational Nursing (VN) Program will prepare students with the basic competencies to become safe practitioners in the healthcare field. Upon successful completion of the Level II Certificate, the graduate will be able to petition for the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (PN) (NCLEX-PN). After successfully passing the exam, the individual will be a licensed practical nurse and can work in hospitals, day-surgery centers, rehabilitation centers, physicians' offices, home health care agencies, among other areas. The Vocational Nursing (VN) Program at South Texas College is approved by the Texas Board of Nursing (TBON).

This **guide** has been developed to provide prospective VN students with information about the VN program and application process. Please follow the steps.

Selective Program

The VN Program is a selective program with application requirements. Students must meet all program application requirements before being eligible to apply. To be considered for program admission, applications must be submitted during the application periods, as published on the Vocational Nursing Program webpage. Due to limited resources, some applicants who meet all program application requirements may not be admitted to the program for the current application period.

Program Selection Process

The VN Program selection process is **Competitive Entry** and is **based on a Competitive Point System**. Points are awarded based on a Point System from: pre-requisite courses, HESI A2 exam scores, STC Cumulative GPA, and other additional points as listed in the Application Form. A **Cutoff Score** is calculated for each application period based on the qualified applicant pool, the number of slots available, and may vary for each application period. Qualified applications are ranked from highest to lowest points and admission is based solely on this ranking. Students are assigned site placement (Starr, Mid-Valley, and McAllen) based on the physical address during the selection process.

Vocational Nursing Degree Plan

The Vocational Nursing Degree is designed for individuals who would like to pursue a nursing career. Students must meet the program application requirements before applying to the program. Upon completion of the Vocational Nursing, the graduate will be able to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN). The Vocational Nursing is a one-year program. Students must successfully pass every semester to continue in the program.

Step 1: ADMISSION TO SOUTH TEXAS COLLEGE

Students are admitted to South Texas College through the provisions of <u>Board Policy 3200</u>. General admission to the College does not imply admission to the Vocational Nursing Program. The Nursing and Allied Health Division offers Selective Programs with application requirements. Prospective students must meet all program application requirements before being eligible to apply to Selective Programs.

Traditional Students

Students must have the listed requirements completed and on file before applying to the program.

Transfer Students

Students transferring from another accredited college or university must comply with <u>Board Policy 3200 and 3320</u>. For further information or assistance, contact The Office of Admissions & Record (OAR) at 956-872-8323 or email admissions@southtexascollege.edu.

Students must have the listed requirements completed and on file before applying to the program.

- Apply for admission online at Apply Texas (<u>www.applytexas.org</u>)
- Submit official transcript(s) from each institution previously attended to the OAR for official transfer course evaluation
- Meet TSI College Readiness Standards, or TSI exemption standards

Note to transfer students: When transferring credits from your former college/university to STC, only the credits transfer, not the GPA.

Step 2: STUDENT INFORMATION SESSION

The VN Program offers **Information Sessions** for interested students. Students are **required** to complete an Information Session, virtually or by reviewing this guide, to learn about the program information & requirements, program tracks, point system-evaluation, application period, and clinical requirements. This is mandatory, due to the high volume of students seeking a Vocational Nursing Degree. Students who complete the Information Session (virtually or by reviewing this guide) will need to successfully complete the Post Exam and obtain a **Certificate of Completion**, which is a document that needs to be submitted with the Vocational Nursing Application.

Virtual Information Session

Information Sessions are offered virtually. Sessions are scheduled approximately one (1) hour and students are recommended to "book a session" via the <u>VN Webpage</u>. It is recommended that the student have a copy of their official or unofficial college or university transcript for review, if applicable. During the virtual session, the student will be able to ask questions during the session. After attending the Virtual Session, the student can schedule a one-to-one <u>follow up appointment</u> with the VN Advisor. Students completing the virtual session are responsible for understanding all program requirements.

Overview of the Step-by-Step Guide

This <u>Step-by-Step Guide</u> is designed for students who are not able to attend a live scheduled Information Session. Once the student has read the Step-by-Step Guide, the student can schedule a <u>follow-up appointment</u> for individualized tailored advising. Students reading the Step-by-Step Guide are responsible for understanding all program requirements.

Certificate of Completion

Students who complete a session, either virtually or by reviewing the Step-by-Step Guide, must successfully complete the Post Exam for the Information Session. The Certificate of Completion is available on the <u>VN Webpage</u>. The certificate is one of the required documents for applying to the VN Program. The certificate must be within the academic year of application submission.

Step 3: PROGRAM INFORMATION & REQUIREMENTS

Program Selection Criteria

The selection criteria are used to assess the applicant's score. Points are given for the following selection criteria:

- 1. Pre-requisites courses
- 2. HESI A2 Exam scores
- 3. Cumulative GPA
- 4. Additional points as listed in the application form for the specific track

Pre-requisites

All pre-requisites must be completed with a grade of "B" or better to be eligible to apply to the VN Program.

VNSG 1420, BIOL2401 and BIOL 2402 do not have an expiration date.

Note: For students transferring BIOL 2401 and/or BIOL 2402 with a separate lecture (3 credits) and lab (1 credit), both courses must be a grade of B or better, and both lecture and lab, must be transferred for a total of 4 credit hours.

HESI A2 (Admission Assessment) Exam

The HESI A2 Exam is an admission requirement for the South Texas College VN Program. The exam consists of academic exams and a personality profile that identifies the applicant's learning style. All students are required to take the exam, *no exceptions*. Total time allotted to complete the exam is 4.25 hours. The instructions to register and take the exam and frequently asked questions can be found on **FAQ FOR HESI A2 EXAM**.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA)

The VN program will award students points on the program application based on the South Texas College cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher at the time of application submission. The cumulative GPA is a compilation of all courses taken at South Texas College, regardless if it was for the VN Program. For students who are transferring courses from another college/university, the GPA does not transfer. Only the grade and credit hours are applied to the Vocational Nursing Degree.

Points will be awarded as follows:

4.00 - 3.5	2 points

Additional Points

The VN program offers applicants the opportunity to earn Additional Points, which are not required when applying to the VN program; however, they will assist applicants to earn additional points towards the total score.

South Texas College Graduate of the Patient Care Technician Program

South Texas College Graduates, who have completed a certificate from **the PCT** program, will be awarded points on the application based on the criteria below. The PTC Certificate must be conferred on the South Texas College transcript. The Online Application will pick up certificate when applying.

 STC Grad with grade of B or higher in each course = 4 points
 □ Patient Care Technician Certificate
 STC Grad with grade of C or higher in each course = 2 points

CSFH 0101 College Success for Healthcare

Students enrolled in College Success for Healthcare course are presented with an overview of the rigorous and challenging environment of healthcare education, and an understanding of the commitment needed to become a successful nursing or allied health professional. Students who complete this course with a grade of B or higher, will be granted points on the application. It is also recommended for students to take this course, if they have been out of school for a long duration of time and want to strengthen their learning skills or earn extra points on the application. Points will be awarded as A = 3 points, and B = 2 points.

Repeating Courses

The VN Program does not deduct points for retaking courses. However, the latest course grade stands and it is the one that will be considered at the time of application.

Program and Clinical Compliance Requirements

Immunization Requirements

Applicants are required to submit proof of the immunizations listed below with the program application.

- Immunization documentation but be visible to read
- Immunizations must be validated by either a stamp or signed by facility or physician
- Must be from a U.S. medical source
- Name and D.O.B. must be documented on all forms
 - o Tetanus/Diphtheria/ Pertussis Tdap: Proof of dose within the last 10 years
 - o Hepatitis B complete 3 vaccine series or proof of positive serology
 - o Measles/Mumps/Rubella MMR 2 doses required or proof of positive serology
 - Varicella (Chicken Pox) 2 doses required or proof of positive serology
 - Meningitis MCV (state requirement for students under the age of 22) one dose within the last five years

For immunization review, please email <u>Clinical Affairs</u> a copy of your immunization record. The clinical affairs specialist will review and inform the student if immunization meet the standards.

Note: Once a student is officially admitted in the VN Program, the student will be required to fulfill additional immunizations and clinical requirements. Further instructions will be provided to the student on your letter of acceptance and the mandatory orientation.

Criminal Background Check through Texas Board of Nursing

In compliance with the Texas Board of Nursing (TBON) requirements, **all** students must submit a criminal background through the TBON.

- 1. Complete the <u>TBON Roster</u> form to start the criminal background check. This process needs to occur 10-12 weeks prior to applying to the VN program.
- 2. Email the form to clinical affairs@southtexascollege.edu.
- 3. Check your email in about 2-3 weeks from submission of the form, for an email from nobody@identogo.com
- 4. Schedule your appointment to get your digital fingerprints done

Upon completion of the TBON background check, the student will receive a Blue Card or an Outcome Letter from the TBON via United States Postal Service. The student must retain the Blue Card or Outcome Letter, and a copy will be required when applying to the Program.

Students with a *positive criminal history* should complete the <u>TBON Roster</u> earlier. The process for students with a positive criminal history may take 6-10 months to complete. If you should get a letter from TBON questioning your history and requesting a Declatory Order, please respond to the letter accordingly.

Note: All Declatory Order decisions are determined solely by the TBON. The Outcome Letter will determine if the student can sit for the National Council Licensure Examination-PN (NCLEX-PN) after the student's criminal background has been reviewed by the TBON and successful completion of the STC VN Program.

Functional Abilities Standards

<u>Functional Abilities Standards</u> are the essential functions, which every STC NAH student is expected to perform and are necessary for successful participation in the VN Program. This form will be completed at the time the application is submitted. These are necessary in order to provide healthcare services in a safe, ethical, and legal manner. Students participating in the VN Program are expected to demonstrate the essential functions listed in this form, with or without reasonable accommodation. These are applicable in classrooms, laboratories, and clinical settings. The STC NAH Program uses independent clinical education sites that may or may not be able to offer the same reasonable accommodations that are made available by the College.

YOU ARE READY TO APPLY

Requirements when submitting Application Online

When Step 1-3 are complete, you are ready to apply using the Online Application.

Vocational Nursing

There are two (2) application periods per year Fall and Spring. The number of students admitted will vary per application period. Students may apply in June/July to be considered for the Fall Program and/or may apply in October/November, to be considered for the Spring Program. Check the <u>VN Webpage</u> for specific application dates and deadlines.

Students must meet all application requirements before being eligible to apply to the VN program. Meeting the application requirements is not a guarantee of program admission. Students must gather all the necessary documentation when submitting the application online. Review the VN Checklist before submitting the application.

Point System Scoring

The VN Program selection process is based on a Point System. The following selection criteria is used to assess the applicant's points.

The maximum points a student can earn on this Point System is twenty-three (23) points. Students are ranked from highest to lowest points. The selection for a cohort is solely based on this ranking.

The Point System Evaluation Form can be found on the <u>VN Webpage</u>. Students are encouraged to explore their grades and points to improve application score. A student's goal is to be as close as possible to the maximum points. The higher the student's score, the higher the probability of being admitted.

NOTIFICATION OF APPLICATION STATUS

The South Texas College Vocational Nursing (VN) Program communicates via Jag email to inform all applicants of their admission status. Notification Letters will be emailed via Jag email on the specified date listed on the <u>VN Webpage</u> Applications and Timelines. Students should make sure the Jag email is working for application status. This is the main form of communication of the VN Program.

Application Status

Qualified applicants with total points **above** the cutoff score will be admitted and applicants with total points **below** the cutoff score will be denied. Applicants with total points **equal** to the cutoff score will be designated as alternates.

Applicants will receive notification of their application status as either "admitted", "alternate", or "denied" via the Jag email address. The program *does not* have a **waiting-list**. Applicants who are not admitted for the current period are encouraged to meet with the VN Program Advisor to discuss alternative options.

Admitted Status

Admitted Applicants must officially accept their admission to the program on or before the mandatory orientation by submitting the Acceptance form. The mandatory orientation will outline all the details of the program, including but not limited to additional immunizations, uniform, clinical requirements, student resources, books and class registration.

Alternate Status

Applicants with total points equal to the cutoff score will be designated as alternates and notified of their application status through Jag email. Should any of the admitted applicants decline admission; an alternate will be offered admissions to the program. A random draw (through a lottery system) of alternate applicants will be used as needed.

Denied Status

Applicants with total points below the cutoff score will be denied and notified of their application status through Jag email. Denied applicants are encouraged to meet with the VN Program Advisor to discuss alternative options such as:

- Applying for other programs within NAH or other Divisions
- Re-applying for the next application period
- Improving score on the application

Upon the denied applicant's request, further consultation can be scheduled with the:

- VN Advisor
 - Applicants can meet with the VN Advisor to review other options or how to improve points for next application period.
- VN Program Chair
 - Applicant can meet with the VN Program Chair after the applicant has met with the VN Program Advisor.
- NAH Division Dean
 - Applicant can meet with the NAH Division Dean after the applicant has met with the VN Program Advisor and VN Program Chair.

FAO FOR HESI A2 EXAM

The HESI A2 Exam is an admission requirement for the VN Program. The exam consists of academic exams and a personality profile that identifies the applicant's learning style. All students are required to take the exam, <u>no</u> <u>exceptions</u>. Total time allotted to complete the exam is 4.25 hours.

Students are required to have HESI passing scores prior to applying to the Vocational Nursing Program. VN applicants are required to have HESI passing scores as part of the program application requirements, within the last two years.

1. How do I register for HESI A2 Exam?

- To register for your HESI Distance Testing you will need an Evolve account. Please create your account on this website Evolve Website.
- Log into your Evolve Account and click on "HESI Assessment Student Access"
- Click on Distance Testing

Note: If you wish to take the Exam with *South Texas College*, follow the steps:

- Log on to the Student Assessment Center http://studentservices.southtexascollege.edu/testing/
- ➤ Choose exam "HESI"
- > Read the instructions regarding HESI
- ➤ Go to the HESI Store and follow the prompts to register for the exam

Note: If you wish to take the Exam with **Prometric**, continue the steps:

- Click on Distance Testing Tab > Register for a Distance Exam
- Complete the required information, check box, and click the submit button
 - Please confirm your first and last name match your government-issued photo ID with signature
 - Click Tab on your keyboard to populate information
 - o Enter school's department ID 199281
 - Select the appropriate exam

*IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- ➤ Do not use the school's department ID as your student ID when creating your student Evolve account.
- > The first and last name on your Evolve account must be the same as it appears on your government issued photo ID with signature (i.e. Driver's License or Passport). You will not be admitted into the testing lab if there is any discrepancy between what is listed on your Evolve student account and what is presented on your ID.
- Your government issued ID must include your signature and a photo that resembles your current appearance to gain admittance into the testing center (your middle name/initial is not required).

You will receive an email Confirmation Notice indicating that you may schedule your exam. Carefully review the information contained in your Confirmation Notice. If your name is not correct, or has been changed, please contact Elsevier HESI Assessment at <a href="mailto:example

2. How much does the HESI A2 Exam cost?

The price for the exam with South Texas College is \$70. The price for the exam with Prometric is approximately \$115c. When registering for the exam, be prepared with a Debit/Credit Card. The fee is the same if you re-test on a section or all sections.

3. Where can I take HESI?

You can take HESI with *South Texas College or Prometric*. To take the HESI with South Texas College, visit the <u>Student Assessment Center</u> and follow the prompts or refer to question 1. To take the HESI with Prometric follow the steps on the Evolve website.

4. What is tested?



- You may also view the book at most South Texas College Center for Learning Centers (CLE)

6. What scores do I have to attain on the HESI A2 Exam?

Each <u>section</u> must be passed with a 70% or higher. Below is an example of the HESI Exam formula for the VN Program application.

HESI Points awarded per category 100% - 90% = 3 points 89% - 83% = 2 points 82% - 70% = 1 point

Example

Section	Score
English Language Composite Score (all 7 exams)	75% = 1 point
Science Composite Score: Anatomy & Physiology only	80% = 1 point
Math Score	88% = 2 points

HESI Score = 4 points

7. When will I receive my exam scores?

Exam scores are available immediately after completion of the exam. If you are unsure if you passed your HESI Exam, please visit the VN Advisor for clarification. Your scores are also available on your HESI account 24/7 through the Evolve Elsevier website.

8. Do I have to take HESI A2 if I have a Doctoral degree, Master's degree, Bachelor's degree, Associates degree, or Certificate?

Students who have attained a doctoral, masters, bachelors, associates and/or a certificate are still required to take the HESI exam. All students applying to the Vocational Nursing Program or the Associate Degree Nursing Programs are required to take HESI and meet the passing scores, no exceptions.

9. What if I don't pass the HESI A2 Exam the first time?

You may retake the HESI Version 2 Exam after a 2-3 week waiting period. You will retest with a different version (version 2) of the exam— no student will have the same exam items twice.

If you fail the exam on the second attempt, you must wait until the next eligibility period to test. You can test for HESI A2 Exam six times per year, which is two times per eligibility period.

You can repeat the exam if you scored under 70% or 75% on a required test section and repeat that section within the same "eligibility period" as the first exam. If student decides or wishes to improve scores (on either version 1 or version 2), the highest score of 70% or better will be taken into consideration within the same eligibility period.

Do not register for the HESI A2 on a third time attempt within the same eligibility periods. Registration fees will not be refunded and scores will not be accepted.

Eligibility periods are: January 1 through May 31

June 1 through August 31

September 1 through December 31

10. Do I have to pay for the entire exam if I retest?

Yes, the exam is the same fee whether you test for the entire exam or retest on a section(s). Please make sure you retest within the eligibility period of the first exam.

11. How long are my A2 Exam scores valid?

HESI scores are valid for 2 years from the time of completion.
